Sacramental Programs

We expect to have our usual fallow year for Confirmations (running our next course in 2018) unless there are a good sized group of candidates.

We will shortly have forms for signing up for the 2017/18 First Holy Communion course, and there will be an adult course for reception into the Catholic Church/adult confirmation.

Bible Timeline

Following on from our Big Picture course we will run another course, again running either side of the autumn half term. The Big Picture course picked out themes from the Bible in order to build a 'big picture' of the scriptures. This time we are planning to look at a course that helps us get a better overview of the books of the bible and the way they relate to each other. It should work well as a follow up for those who participated in last years course and be accessible to everyone else as well.

Compendium of the Catechism

A couple of weeks talking to parishioners it was clear that most people don't have a copy of the Catechism of the Catholic Church or the shorter Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Both are available online at the Vatican website and available from the Repository at Holy Angels. It is a very good idea to at least have a copy of the Compendium so that we can have a better idea of what our faith teaches. To encourage us we will have a series of extracts from the Compendium in the newsletter.

2. Why does man have a desire for God?
