Give it up 2. During this Sunday's children's liturgy, the children will be encouraged to consider what they can give up for Lent and perhaps use the money saved to buy a CAFOD *World Gift* (e.g. mosquito net $\mathfrak{L}7$). Or the children can pool the money to buy a more substantial gift (e.g. community toilet $\mathfrak{L}85$).

There is a **Recycling Box** in the social room for old and unwanted jewellery, currency, coins, stamps, phones, cameras,electronic gadgets. This will mean extra money for CAFOD.

Lent

There will be a Lent group after the Wednesday morning Mass at Holy Angels run by Father Robin, starting next week. Ann Martindale from Holy Family is running a Lent group, and can be contacted on 01252 681 752.

Gloria Benson is running a Lent group on Tuesday evenings at 7,30pm at Holy Angles.

The Lent material we are using this year is called *"Living Jesus"* and focuses on discipleship and the call to holiness.

Thist Wednesday, February 14 is Ash Wednesday which marks the start of Lent. As one US diocese has noted, "the obligation of fast and abstinence must naturally be the priority of the Catholic community" and it therefore takes priority over the secular celebration of St Valentine's Day.

Perhaps those wanting to mark St Valentines Day would be better to observe this on Tuesday 13, the feast of Mardi Gras, traditionally a time of celebration before the Lenten observance. Catholics are expected to abstain from meat, and fasting should consist of one meal and two collations ('mini meals', which together should add up to no more than one meal).

There will be 3 Masses, on Ash Wednesday at 9.30am and 7.30pm Mass at Holy Angles and at noon at Holy Family.

Next week's readings

One suggestion to help with deepening your spiritual life during Lent is to read and reflect upon next week's readings in advance. These are Genesis 9:8-15, Psalm 24; 4-9, 1 Peter 3:18-22 and Mark 1: 12-15. These can also be found on the Universalis website <u>http://</u> universalis.com/mass.htm

Father Robin also has two book recommendations. *Kevin Vost - The Seven Deadly Sins and Little Sins mean a lot by Elizabeth Scalia.* At the heart of all the Lenten disciplines is the desire to grow closer to Christ. The biggest barrier to this are sins. We talk a lot about the need to change our behaviour and avoid sin but it is not always clear how we should go about this. Kevin Vost's wonderful book draws on both the teaching of the Church and his professional life as a psychologist to help us achieve real change in our lives. [Those sins are Sloth, Envy, Avarice, Vainglory (Pride), Gluttony and Wrath.] A very worthwhile read. Much cheaper on Kindle!

Elizabeth Scalia's book is a good read for those who are sure that they are not guilty of any of the seven deadly sins and wonder what to work on next!
