# Message from Father Robin re Holy Week

What are we doing this week? For many it is just the end of term, the beginning of the bank holiday weekend. For us it is Holy Week. The most important week in the Church's year. We might not have experienced it fully before. But we can make this week <u>different.</u>

You will not regret it. The liturgies (services) are different and speak powerfully of themselves of what Christ endured for us. To travel through the Mass of the Lord's Supper and to watch and pray with Christ. To attend and witness the Good Friday liturgy as Mary stood there looking at her Son on the cross. To enter into the darkness of the tomb on Holy Saturday night and witness the power of the resurrection and the fulfilment of all the prophesies as we wonder at God's love and providence. To know the meaning of joy as we praise God on Easter Day.
