### Love in action

Beginning this Sunday the parishes will explore the LOVE IN ACTION program as part of our parish formation. This particularly supported by the newly formed Holy Angels Justice and Peace team but is intended for both parishes. Over the course of the year we will look at six key themes of Catholic Social Teaching which are part of the basis of the Church's formation for all catholics helping us to reflect on appropriate social mission and action. These themes are: The Dignity and Equality of each human person. The call to participation and community. Preferential Option for the Poor. The Dignity and Rights of Workers. Solidarity among Peoples and the Promotion of Peace. Care for Creation. During this period we invite you to consider and pray about how you too may actively support this important social ministry. Take-home sheets for further reflection/discussion are available from the Team members in the church entrance at Holy Angels or from the back of church at Holy Family; please ask.

## Justice & Peace group

If you want peace, work for justice (Pope Paul V1). Share the Journey. Inspired by Pope Francis' special concern for migrants and refugees, we are all invited to join the *Share the Journey* campaign and a) call on governments to agree on two global 'compacts', b) sign a petition to the Prime Minister - see display board. Additionally, from May to September - in solidarity with people forced to flee – parishioners are invited to undertake a walk: e.g. to church (instead of car), in local park, a pilgrimage...whatever works for you – as individuals, families, or groups. Closing prayer of Evangelium Vitae from St John Paul II
