# CAFOD

Share the Journey. Inspired by Pope Francis' special concern for migrants and refugees, we are all invited to join the Share the Journey campaign and a) call on governments to agree on two global 'compacts', b) sign a petition to the Prime Minister - see display board. Additionally - in solidarity with people forced to flee parishioners are invited to undertake a parish group walk (about 1.5 miles) on Sunday 22nd July after the 11A.M. Mass. We shall start and finish at the church. Alternatively parishioners may undertake their own walk: e.g. to church (instead of using car), in local park, a pilgrimage...whatever works for you. Then tell us and we shall add your miles to a national grand total, which will be used to encourage world leaders to step up in support of refugees and migrants worldwide too. #### Safe carwash app

Safe Car Wash App: The campaign 'Safe Car Wash App' was launched by the Church of England and the Catholic Church in England and Wales amid growing concerns that some of the estimated 18,000 hand car washes operating around the country are exploiting workers. The app lets drivers punch in their location when arriving at a car wash then flick through a series of slavery indicators such as whether the car wash only accepts cash, evidence of workers living on site or whether the workers seem fearful. If the answers indicate a high likelihood of slavery, users will be directed to a modern slavery helpline.
