40 Days for Life is a focused pro-life campaign with a vision to access God's power during a focused 40 day campaign in which people in local communities pledge to seek an end to abortion through prayer, fasting, and peaceful activism. The campaign runs from Wednesday September 26th to Sunday November 4th, worldwide. The campaign also commits to a 40-day prayer vigil outside an abortion centre (e.g Bournemouth). Additionally, some form of community outreach accompanies the vigils. More information available.
