Bishop Richard has been reflecting on the submissions from all the parishes in the diocese to produce a pastoral plan to take us forward to where we need to be as a diocese for 2030. There will be an open meeting in every deanery to enable him to present the plan to us and give us a chance to talk to him about it. For us in Guildford deanery he will be coming to visit us on the evening of **Monday 19th November**, St Joseph's Guildford. Please keep this date in your diary, & sign the list in church.

Justice & Peace group

Love in Action. This month's theme is: '*The Dignity and Rights of Workers*'. The work people do should be valued, because the person him/herself must be valued. As part of this, people deserve a fair, just wage and proper working conditions within which to carry out their role.... It is one of the reasons that the Church has been, and continues to be, so involved with the 'Living Wage' and 'Fair Trade' movements, both of which seek a just wage and adequate working conditions for the working people. Collect a detailed *take-home sheet*, and a "Who picked my tea?" card, after Mass. We shall also focus on this theme in the **DOCAT study groups**.

World Mission Sunday. This year the Bishops of England & Wales will use the annual collection for the missions to help support the work of the Church in Ethiopia, one of the oldest Christian communities. The average annual salary is just £400 so the Church needs outside support if it is to spread the gospel, build churches, schools and medical centres to help those in need. Therefore, this week a member of the Justice & Peace team will be at each of the Masses to supply further information and offer you the opportunity to become one of our parish group of Red Box holders, supporting the missions on a regular basis by putting aside any loose change that you may have. Please be generous.

Brick Fund Project 5 Guildford provide emergency shelter and ongoing support to help the homeless into independent living. Donating to a 'Brick Fund' will assist their clients to meet the initial cost of £1000 approx. needed to acquire independent rented accommodation. Carefully assessed clients will agree to repay the money gradually to enable others to benefit also. We suggest donations of £1 per brick. See board in the church entrance area.

Fairtrade Stall. You might have seen in the news recently that Traidcraft is facing difficult times. Since 1979, Traidcraft has been pioneering fair trade in the UK and currently works with over 100 producers from 30 countries.
