Justice and Peace

Justice and Peace Assembly This was well attended last Saturday and focussed on the ever-worsening issue of homelessness. Take the example of one young man in regular employment who felt compelled to leave his job and become his granny's full-time carer which meant moving in with her. When she died, he was then forced to vacate her rented accommodation and could not afford a deposit and first month's rent for alternative accommodation. He ended up homeless; which is a situation that immediately impacts on other basic needs, such as receiving correspondence, and washing and changing clothes (for interviews). Please therefore donate to Holy Angels' 'Brick Fund' (£1 per brick) in aid of the Project 5 Guildford Homeless Shelter - see Holy Angels entrance hall for details.
