#### Ash Wednesday

Wednesday 26h February is Ash Wednesday; fasting and abstinence. Fasting is a considerable reduction in food, abstinence is from flesh meat (or in the case of vegetarians another food group) and is mandatory for those 14 and over; fasting from the age of 18 until 60. In practice the equivalent of two meals and no snacks.

Please note that Ash Wednesday Masses will be celebrated as follows:-

Holy Angels - 9.30am and 7.30pm; and

Holy Family - 12.30pm.

## **Evangelizing Catholics 'Book Club'**

We are encouraging everyone to read Scott Hahn's 'Evangelizing Catholics' as a good way of engaging with the call for each one of us to engage with the new evangelization.

'In the early church Christianity offered something different from the Roman Society around it.....following the laws of the Jewish people, Christian communities strictly forbade both infanticide and abortion. Similarl prohibitions existed against divorce, adultery, spousal abuse and any form of unnatural relations. Husbands were urged to love their wives "as Christ loved the Church", and Christian women had much greater freedom to take a husband or not as they saw fit.....As pagan Rome died off, Christian Rome flourished. In part, that's because the Christians didn't kill their females. (Evangelizing Catholics p.76)

There is a 'reading group' meeting at Holy Angels on Saturday mornings at 10am, to encourage us all to make progress reading through the book whether we can meet together or not. Each meeting will stand alone to look at the relevant chapters as we read through the book, so don't feel inhibited from coming along if you can't come along every time.

The next meeting will be on 29th February (when we will reflect on chapters 9 & 10). Further dates TBA. This is the first step towards forming a small mission group, but joining the reading group does not commit you to anything else.
