According to figures from the World Health Organisation (WHO), between 40 and 56 million abortions are performed every year. Evangelizing Catholics 'Book Club'

We are encouraging everyone to read Scott Hahn's 'Evangelizing Catholics' as a good way of engaging with the call for each one of us to engage with the new evangelization.

'In the early church Christianity offered something different from the Roman Society around it.....following the laws of the Jewish people, Christian communities strictly forbade both infanticide and abortion. Similarl prohibitions existed against divorce, adultery, spousal abuse and any form of unnatural relations. Husbands were urged to love their wives "as Christ loved the Church", and Christian women had much greater freedom to take a husband or not as they saw fit.....As pagan Rome died off, Christian Rome flourished. In part, that's because the Christians didn't kill their females.
