Act now: NI Abortion Bill Earlier this year the Northern Ireland Assembly voted on the					
	Severe Fetal Impairment Abortion (Amendment) Bill and it passed				
	Second Stage by 48 votes to 12. This Bill will remove the current				
	grounds in the NI abortion regulations that allow abortion right up				
	to birth for 'severe fetal impairment' which includes babies with				
	disabilities including Down's syndrome, cleft lip and club foot.				
	The NI Health Committee is now undertaking a consultation on the				
	Bill and is seeking submissions from the public. It is important				
	that as many people as possible submit to the consultation in				
	support of the Bill to clearly show that there is widespread support
