Pope Francis has published an open letter to married couples as part of the Amoris Laetitia Family Year. Speaking about the undertaking the Pope said:

"The present situation has made me want to accompany, with humility, affection and openness, each individual, married couple and family in all those situations in which you find yourselves."

The Pope highlighted that our Christian faith reminds us that we are not alone in the challenges of married life, and that Jesus is present as time passes and children are born and grow up, and work and illness ebb and flow: "Your lives become a single life; you become a 'we' in loving communion with Jesus, alive and present at every moment of your existence."
