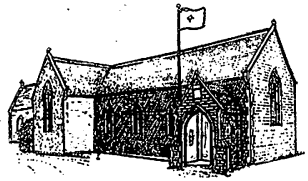
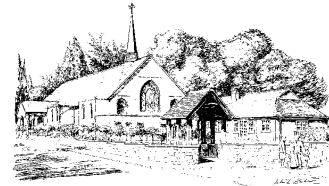

The next **Baptism Evening will take place in September. (Wed 21 September tbc)** If you have an infant for baptism please fill in a baptism application form, and return it to the parish office before the preparation evening which will be held online.

In September and October this year, the relics of St Bernadette will journey on pilgrimage to England, Scotland, and Wales for the very first time. This once in a lifetime event will provide an opportunity for people of all ages and backgrounds to experience the gifts and charisms of Lourdes, in a church or cathedral near them, with the relics visiting three venues in our Diocese

Live streaming. As life continues to return to normal we intend to reduce our live streaming of masses to a single 11am Sunday mass to support those who are housebound or particularly vulnerable. Most people should now be returning to mass and fulfilling their mass obligation.

Holy Hour for Vocations

What is the link between Fr's Robin, David and Graham who celebrated Mass with us during July and Fr's Richard and Keith past and current priests where my sister attends Mass? The answer is that all five were previously Anglican clergy and without their joining us we might well be seeing a different priest minister to us each week or, as has happened in other areas, our seeking somewhere else to attend Mass. Whilst it might not be possible for everyone to attend the Holy Hour on the first Wednesday of each month we can all, and should, pray regularly for vocations. The need for more men to test their vocation to the priesthood is greater than it has ever been and also as deacons. A deacon can take some of the pressure off of the parish priest not just by preaching at Mass but also undertaking baptisms, marriages and funerals, etc. Our prayers have never been so important.

Compendium of the Catechism

218. What is the liturgy? (1066-1070)

The liturgy is the celebration of the mystery of Christ and in particular his paschal mystery. Through the exercise of the priestly office of Jesus Christ the liturgy manifests in signs and brings about the sanctification of humankind.

The public worship which is due to God is offered by the Mystical Body of Christ, that is, by its head and by its members.

219. What place does the liturgy occupy in the life of the Church?

The liturgy as the sacred action par excellence is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed and it is likewise the font from which all her power flows.

Through the liturgy Christ continues the work of our redemption in, with and through his Church.

220. In what does the sacramental economy consist?

The sacramental economy consists in the communication of the fruits of Christ's redemption through the celebration of the sacraments of the Church, most especially that of the Eucharist, “until he comes” (1 Corinthians 11:26).
