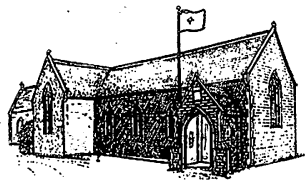
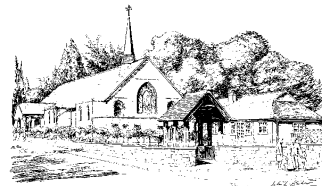

CAFOD FAST DAY

the Church's Aid and Development Agency, marks its annual Family Fast Day on 7 October with an appeal to Catholics in England and Wales to help the millions of people around the world struggling to put food on the table. The world food crisis could be the worst in living memory. CAFOD's local experts are working hard to provide emergency food supplies to families in the worst affected countries in East Africa.

"It's very distressing to be unable to feed your children," says Talaso from Marsabit in Kenya. "As a mother, that's the most distressing thing of all."

20 million people are fighting for their survival through a crisis that has largely been created by other disasters. Climate change, coronavirus, and the conflict in Ukraine, are causing food prices to rocket. As each day goes by, the situation worsens.

On Friday 7 October, we can play our part by supporting CAFOD's Family Fast Day with our prayers, solidarity and, if possible, donations.

Any contribution will help CAFOD's local experts deliver emergency food and water and help cover school fees and school meals for the hardest-hit families.

Food Bank

We usually mark Harvest by asking for donations to the Farnham Food Bank. Donations can be brought to either church. They currently need:

Tinned meat - ham, pork, stew
Tinned Rice Pudding
Tinned potatoes
Boxes of chocolates
Boxes of Pringles

All must have at least 3 months before their best before date.

In September and October this year, the relics of St Bernadette will journey on pilgrimage to England, Scotland, and Wales for the very first time. The story of St Bernadette is a remarkable one. A young girl who grew up in a poor family, Bernadette Soubirous

received apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary when she was 14 years old.

Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, she witnessed 18 visions at the grotto of Massabielle, near the River Gave in the village of Lourdes.

A date to remember

When St. Bernadette asked the lady who she was on the 25 March 1858, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception"- revealing herself to be the Virgin-Mother of God.

Bernadette was beatified in 1925 and canonised by Pope Pius XI on December 8, 1933, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Since then, her life and legacy has touched millions of lives.

UK tour

During her life, Bernadette never travelled outside of her home country of France, yet millions of people over generations have come to the Sanctuary at Lourdes, which has a long tradition of welcoming the sick.

As a Saint, her relics have travelled beyond the borders of France to countries such as the United States, and now for the very first time, a relic of St Bernadette will tour England, Scotland, and Wales this September and October.
